2015 marks the 15th annual Intertribal Nursery Council (INC) meeting. We are pleased to announce this year's gathering will be hosted jointly by the Western Forestry & Conservation Nursery Association and the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR). The event will be held **September 22-24**, in **Pendleton**, **Oregon**.

Tour and Dinner

Tours will be Tuesday and Wednesday morning. They will include a visit to the CTUIR Tribal Native Plant Nursery and a restoration outplanting site. A traditional-style dinner from the host tribe will be held on Tuesday evening.

Nursery Training Workshop

Since the publication of the USDA Agricultural Handbook 730, *Nursery Manual for Native Plants: A Guide for Tribal Nurseries*, the INC has initiated the teaching of Nursery Training Modules taken directly from the manual. These modules cover content from the publication's individual chapters, in addition to the latest information available since publication. A Call for Presentations

The INC hosts are seeking a few more speakers for this year's annual meeting. In the past, presentation topics included overviews or updates from tribal nurseries, restoration efforts using native plants, native plant research projects, and conservation education efforts. Travel Grants
