

# Brian Ferebee

On September 30, 2016, Forest Service Chief Tom Tidwell appointed agency veteran Brian Ferebee as the Regional Forester of the Rocky Mountain Region (R2).

Prior to this appointment, Brian was serving as the Associate Deputy Chief for the National Forest System, where he was responsible for the policy, oversight, and direction of the natural resource programs for the 193 million acres of National Forests and Grasslands.

Brian has served in a variety of leadership positions, including Deputy Regional Forester for the Rocky Mountain Region, Forest Supervisor on the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forests, Forest Supervisor on the Uinta National Forest, Deputy Forest Supervisor on the Pike and San Isabel National Forests and the Cimarron and Comanche National Grasslands, and District Ranger on the Kamas and Logan Districts of the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forests.



Earlier assignments include the Emmett Ranger District of the Boise National Forest in Idaho; wildlife biologist and district ranger on the Salt Lake, Kamas and Logan Ranger Districts of the Wasatch-Cache National Forest; and Wildlife Program Manager in the Intermountain Region's Regional Office in Ogden, Utah.

Brian was born and raised in Elizabeth City, North Carolina and graduated from North Carolina State University in 1989 with a Bachelor of Science degree in natural resource management. He and his wife, Kate, enjoy outdoor experiences and international travel.
