Dr. David Augustine is a Research Ecologist with the Rangeland Resources & Systems Research Unit within the USDA Agricultural Research Service, based in Fort Collins, CO. His research interests focus on the influence of herbivores, particularly those with hooves, on the structure, function, and diversity of ecosystems. He received his MS in Wildlife Conservation from the University of Minnesota, and PhD in Biology from Syracuse University. Dr. Augustine's research addresses both basic and applied questions about the role of native and domestic herbivores (and the people who manage them) on grasslands and savannas of East Africa and central North America. A current major focus of his research in the Great Plains is quantifying tradeoffs and synergies among livestock production and biodiversity conservation.
