

**Presenter: Kenneth W. Tate, Department of Plant Sciences, University of California, Davis.**

Kenneth W. Tate is Professor and Cooperative Extension Specialist of Rangeland Science in the Department of Plant Sciences at the University of California, Davis. He holds the Russell L. Rustici Endowed Chair in Rangeland Watershed Sciences. Ken's research and outreach program focuses on 1) quantifying rangeland management impacts on water resources; 2) evaluating management measures to conserve and enhance water resources; and 3) developing assessment and monitoring tools to inform management adaptation and policy development. He teaches *Rangeland Ecology and Management*. Ken has received the Rangeland Conservation Impact Award from the California Rangeland Trust in 2016, the James H. Meyer Distinguished Achievement Award from UC Davis in 2015, the Eric Bradford and Charlie Rominger Agricultural Sustainability Leadership Award in 2012, and the Outstanding Achievement Award for Academia from the Society for Range Management in 2011. Ken received his undergraduate and graduate education in rangeland management and water resources from Oklahoma State University. He joined the faculty at UC Davis in 1995.
