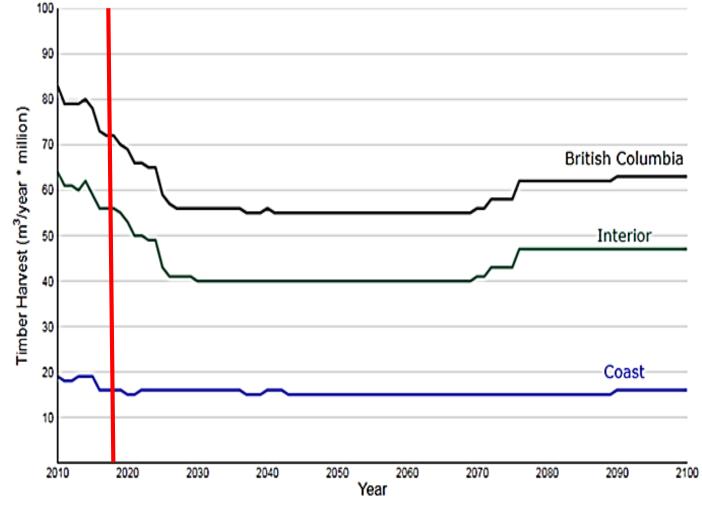
NORTH AMERICAN LUMBER PRODUCTION BY REGION (BBF)

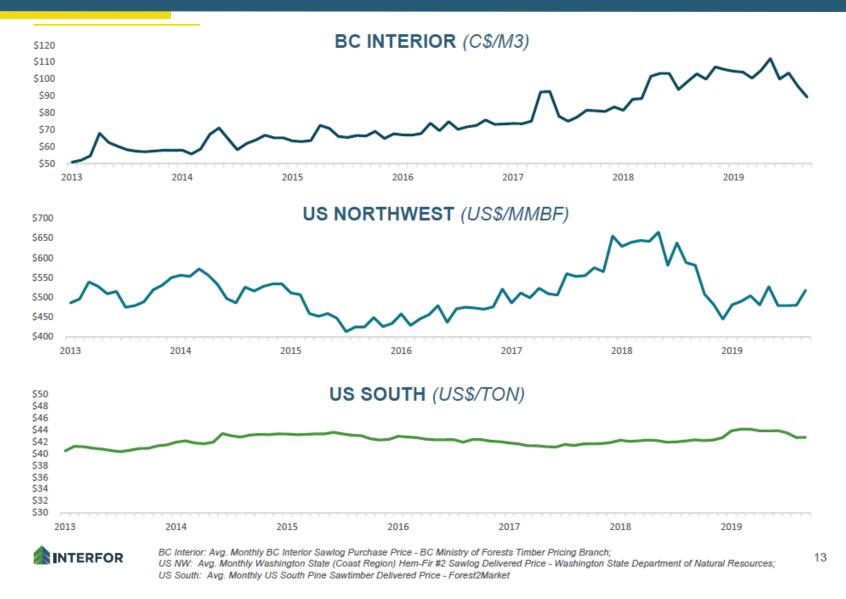

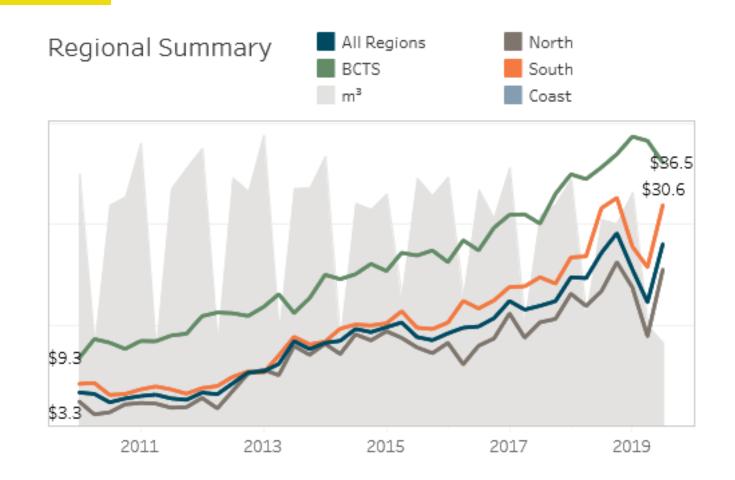


REGIONAL LOG COSTS

STUMPAGE 101

- **Stumpage** = Value Cost
- Value = Estimated Winning Bid (BC Timber Sales) and Average Market Values
 - Determined through a regression of BCTS historical winning bids (multiple years)
 - "Dummy" variable sets the relative level of the regression (annually)
- Cost = Activities incurred by tenure holder that aren't incurred by BCTS licensees

BILL 22 FOREST ACT AMENDMENT

- Government control over the disposition of Crown tenures;
- Ensure that public interest is considered in the disposition of Forest Act agreements;
- Ensure that dispositions and changes of control do not result in further concentration within the forestry sector;

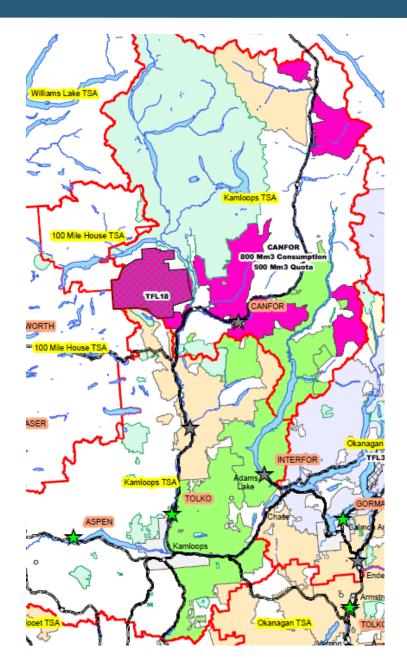

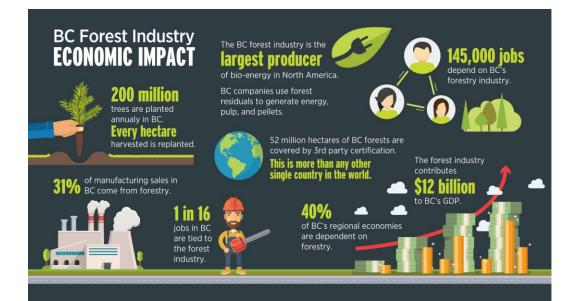
